


# Michigan's Job Vacancy Survey 2015

MICHIGAN HAD AN ESTIMATED 145,000 JOB VACANCIES IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF 2015


AN ESTIMATED 63 PERCENT OF VACANCIES WERE FOR FULL--TIME POSITIONS



MANY VACANCIES REQUIRED A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF EXPERIENCE

AN ESTIMATED 76% OF VACANCIES OFFERED AT LEAST ONE BENEFIT




67 percent of vacancies offered health insurance, 63 percent offered retirement/pension, and 61 percent offered paid leave

24 PERCENT OF VACANCIES WERE OPEN FOR 90 DAYS OR MORE



The length of time a vacancy is open may be one indication that the position is difficult to fill.
