March Jobless Rates Decline in All Michigan Regional Labor Markets

Lansing – Seasonally unadjusted unemployment rates in March fell in all of the state’s 17 major labor market areas, according to the Michigan Department of Technology, Management & Budget. Total employment levels advanced in most regions over the month, while workforce totals declined in nearly all areas.

“March 2017 was a favorable month for Michigan’s local labor markets,” said Jason Palmer, director of the Bureau of Labor Market Information & Strategic Initiatives. “Employment levels were mainly up and jobless rates moved downward.”

Between February and March, unemployment rates decreased in all 17 major regions, with drops ranging from -0.6 to -1.7 percentage points. The median over-the-month rate reduction was a full percentage point. The largest jobless rate cuts in March were displayed in the Northeast Lower Michigan region (-1.7), the Niles-Benton Harbor Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) (-1.3), and the Bay City MSA (-1.2). In March, nine state regions posted rates at or below the national seasonally unadjusted unemployment rate of 4.6 percent.

Unemployment Rates Down Over Year

Since March 2016, jobless rates fell in all 17 regions, with a median decrease of -0.6 of a percentage point. The largest over-the-year rate reductions were registered in the Muskegon MSA (-0.8), the Northwest Lower Michigan region (-0.8), and the Jackson MSA (-0.7).

Total Employment Up Over Month, Year

From February to March, total employment rose modestly in 15 regions, with a minor median advance of +0.4 percent. The most pronounced over-the-month employment gains were shown in the Detroit-Warren-Dearborn MSA (+0.9%), the Jackson MSA (+0.7%), and the Muskegon MSA (+0.7%). Total employment declined very slightly in March in the Lansing-East Lansing MSA and the Northwest Lower Michigan region.

Since March 2016 total employment rose in 11 areas, declined in five, and was unchanged in the Bay City MSA. Over-the-year employment gains ranged from +0.1 to +2.2 percent with a median hike of +1.1 percent. The largest increases since last March were posted in the Detroit-Warren-Dearborn MSA (+2.2%), the Grand Rapids-Wyoming MSA (+2.0%), and the Kalamazoo-Portage MSA (+1.6%). Over-the-year employment reductions were limited to a half percent or less with the largest declines recorded in the Upper Peninsula (-0.5%), and the Saginaw MSA (-0.4%).

Note: Labor force, employment, and unemployment data for 2012 through 2016 have been recently revised. Payroll job data by industry was revised for 2015 and 2016. Labor Force Levels Down Over Month, Mixed Over Year

During March, workforce levels decreased in 16 state regions, while the labor force level in the Detroit-Warren-Dearborn MSA edged up slightly by +0.1 percent. Labor force reductions over the month ranged from -0.2 to -1.7 percent with a median decline of -0.7 percent.

Between March 2016 and March 2017 labor force levels declined in eight regions, increased in seven areas, and were unchanged in the Northeast Lower Michigan region and the Niles-Benton Harbor MSA. The largest workforce reductions since March 2016 were recorded in the Upper Peninsula

(-1.1%), and the Midland MSA (-1.0%), while the biggest gains occurred in the Detroit-Warren-Dearborn MSA (+1.7%), and the Grand Rapids-Wyoming MSA (+1.4%).

Widespread Gains Push March Payroll Jobs Upward

The monthly survey of employers indicated that seasonally unadjusted payroll jobs in Michigan increased by 19,000 or 0.5 percent in March to 4,327,000. Moderate over-the-month job advances were posted in trade, transportation and utilities (+5,000), construction (+3,000), professional and business services (+3,000), and leisure and hospitality services (+3,000). The state's remaining major sectors recorded mostly small job gains.

In March, payroll jobs rose in 13 of the state's 14 major metropolitan areas. Regional job gains ranged from +0.1 percent to +1.0 percent with a median advance of +0.6 percent. The Monroe (+1.0%), Muskegon (+1.0%), and Jackson (+0.9%) MSAs stood out as having the largest over-the-month job increases. Jobs in the Bay City MSA were essentially unchanged in March.

Since March 2016, seasonally unadjusted payroll jobs rose statewide by 77,000 or 1.8 percent. Nearly all major industry sectors in the state recorded job gains since March 2016, and were led by increases in professional and business services (+20,000), education and health services (+11,000), government (+10,000), leisure and hospitality services (+9,000), manufacturing (+8,000), and construction (+7,000).

Since March 2016, payroll jobs moved up in ten of the 14 Michigan metro areas. Area increases ranged from +0.3 to +2.6 percent, with a median gain of +1.2 percent. Notable over-the-year regional advances were recorded in the Grand Rapids-Wyoming (+2.6%), Kalamazoo-Portage (+2.3%), Ann Arbor (+2.1%), Detroit-Warren-Dearborn (+2.1%), and Lansing-East Lansing (+2.1%) MSAs. Over-the-year payroll jobs were essentially flat in the Jackson, Muskegon, and Saginaw MSAs, while payroll jobs declined in the Monroe MSA (-0.5%).

County Jobless Rates Down Over Month, Year

All of Michigan's 83 counties recorded jobless rate reductions in March, with a median decline of -1.1 percentage points. Since March 2016, unemployment rates fell in 82 counties, with a median decrease of -0.7 of a percentage point. The jobless rate in Cheboygan County rose slightly by +0.3 of a percentage point over the year.

*Note: Data in this release is **not seasonally adjusted**. As a result, employment and unemployment trends may differ from previously released Michigan seasonally adjusted data.*
