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February Unemployment Rates Increase Slightly in Most of Michigan's Regional Labor Markets

Lansing – Seasonally unadjusted unemployment rates in February edged upward over the month in 13 of the state's 17 major labor market areas, according to the Michigan Department of Technology, Management & Budget. Total employment increased in most regions over the month, while labor force levels advanced in all of Michigan's major labor market areas.

"The small jobless rate increases throughout most of the state in February mainly indicated the continued entry of unemployed individuals into Michigan's local labor markets," said Jason Palmer, director of the Bureau of Labor Market Information & Strategic Initiatives. "Both total employment and the number of unemployed rose in the majority of Michigan's local regions in February, which reflected a recent trend. Workforce levels were up in nearly all regional labor markets over the year."

From January to February, jobless rate increases ranged from 0.1 to 0.8 of a percentage point with a minor median advance of 0.2 of a percentage point. By far the largest over-the-month rate gains occurred in both the Northeast and Northwest Lower Michigan regions, with unemployment rate hikes of 0.8 and 0.6 of a percentage point respectively. Unemployment rates declined slightly over the month in the Lansing-East Lansing (-0.4), Detroit-Warren-Dearborn (-0.3), and Monroe (-0.2) Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs). The jobless rate in the Ann Arbor MSA was unchanged in February.

Unemployment Rates Fall Over Year

Since February 2015, jobless rates fell in all of the state's major labor markets. Over-the-year rate reductions ranged from -0.7 to -1.5 percentage points with a median decline of -1.1 percentage points. The largest unemployment rate decreases over this period were displayed in the Northeast and Northwest Lower Michigan regions along with the Muskegon MSA.

Total Employment Up Over Month, Year

From January to February, total employment rose in 15 regions and declined slightly in the Northeast and Northwest Lower Michigan regions. The most pronounced over-the-month gains were posted in the Lansing-East Lansing, Monroe, Ann Arbor, and Niles-Benton Harbor MSAs.

Since February 2015, total employment rose significantly in all 17 regions, recording a very robust 3.2 percent median advance. The largest percentage gains over this period were posted in the Monroe, Ann Arbor, Grand Rapids-Wyoming, and Kalamazoo-Portage MSAs.

Note: Labor force, employment, and unemployment data for 2011-2015 have been recently revised. Payroll job data by industry was revised for 2014 and 2015; and in some cases back to 1990. Labor Force Levels Up Over Month, Year

From January to February, workforce levels rose in all 17 major regions in the state. Labor force level increases ranged from 0.4 to 1.7 percent in February with a median gain of 1.0 percent.

Since February 2015, labor force levels advanced in 15 areas, and declined slightly in the Jackson MSA. The workforce level in the Upper Peninsula was essentially unchanged over the year. Overthe-year increases ranged from 0.9 to 3.4 percent with a median gain of 1.9 percent.

Seasonal Gains in Government and Private Education Push February Payroll Jobs Upward The monthly survey of employers indicated that seasonally unadjusted payroll jobs in Michigan increased by 25,000 or 0.6 percent in February to 4,247,000. February payroll job gains were highlighted by increases in government (+15,000), education and health services (+6,000), and professional and business services (+3,000). Jobs in trade, transportation and utilities posted a seasonal reduction in February of -4,000. The state's remaining major sectors recorded mostly minor changes over the month.

Within the government sector, jobs in state government education (+7,000), and local government education (+6,000) advanced seasonally due to the continued return of students to colleges, universities and local schools following the holiday break. Job gains in education and health services were primarily due to a seasonal increase in private education (+6,000).

From January to February, payroll jobs rose in 11 of the state's 14 metropolitan regions. Job gains in the 11 metro regions ranged from 0.2 to 2.1 percent with a moderate median advance of 0.6 percent. Payroll jobs declined slightly over the month in the Bay City and Flint MSAs, while jobs were essentially flat in the Saginaw MSA.

From February 2015 to February 2016, seasonally unadjusted payroll jobs rose statewide by 89,000 or 2.1 percent. Nearly all major sectors in the state posted job gains over this period, with increases in manufacturing (+17,000), professional and business services (+17,000), education and health services (+13,000), and leisure and hospitality services (+13,000) leading the way.

Since February 2015, payroll jobs rose in 12 of the 14 metropolitan regions of the state, with a median job gain of 2.1 percent. Payroll jobs were down over the year in the Jackson and Midland MSAs.

County Jobless Rates Up Over Month, Down Over Year

Fifty-nine of Michigan's 83 counties recorded mostly moderate unemployment rate increases in February, with a median hike of only 0.4 of a percentage point. Most of the larger over-the-month rate increases occurred in the state's northern areas. Rates declined slightly in 19 counties over the month, while the rates in five counties were unchanged.

Since February 2015, jobless rates fell in all 83 counties, with drops ranging from -0.6 to -3.0 percentage points and a median reduction of -1.2 percentage points.

Note: Data in this release is **not seasonally adjusted**. As a result, employment and unemployment trends may differ from previously released Michigan seasonally adjusted data. A breakdown of seasonally unadjusted February workforce estimates for Michigan and its 17 major labor market areas follows, along with a listing of county jobless rates for February.
