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November Jobless Rates Display Little Change in Most of Michigan's Regional Labor Markets

Lansing – Seasonally unadjusted regional unemployment rates were relatively stable in November, as rates edged down in nine of the state's 17 major labor market areas, according to the Michigan Department of Technology, Management & Budget. Total employment and labor force levels increased over the month in most regions.

"Michigan's local labor markets in November recorded very typical patterns for this time of the year," said Jason Palmer, director of the Bureau of Labor Market Information & Strategic Initiatives. "Jobless rates were fairly stable in most of the state's southern areas, while rates showed notable seasonal increases in the northern regions."

From October to November, unemployment rates fell modestly in nine areas, rose in five, and were unchanged in the Bay City, Kalamazoo-Portage, and Saginaw Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs). November jobless rate reductions ranged from -0.1 to -1.0 percentage points with a median decline of only -0.2 of a percentage point. The largest over-the-month rate decreases were posted in the Monroe and Ann Arbor MSAs, down by -1.0 and -0.5 percentage points respectively. Of the five regions that recorded rate hikes, the largest by far were seasonal and registered in the state's three northernmost regions. The unemployment rate in the Northeast Lower Michigan region rose by 1.2 percentage points, and the rates in both the Upper Peninsula and the Northwest Lower Michigan region increased by a half percentage point. In November, 11 of the 17 Michigan regions displayed unemployment rates at or below the national seasonally unadjusted rate of 4.4 percent.

Unemployment Rates Rise Modestly Over Year

Since November 2015, jobless rates rose slightly in 16 of the state's major regions. Rate hikes ranged from 0.3 to 0.8 of a percentage point with a median advance of 0.4 of a percentage point. The largest over-the-year rate increases were recorded in the Northeast Lower Michigan (+0.8), and the Niles-Benton Harbor (+0.6), and Midland (+0.6) MSAs. The unemployment rate in the Detroit-Warren-Dearborn MSA was unchanged over the year.

Total Employment Up Over Month, Year

During November, total employment advanced in 12 regions and declined in five. Area increases ranged from 0.4 to 1.5 percent, with a median gain of 0.9 percent. The Ann Arbor, Jackson, and Flint MSAs led the over-the-month additions. Of the regions with November employment reductions, the only notable drops were seasonal, and were posted in the Northeast Lower Michigan region (-1.7%), the Upper Peninsula (-1.3%), and the Northwest Lower Michigan region (-1.2%).

Since November 2015, total employment advanced in 11 regions with a median gain of 1.3 percent. The Ann Arbor, Detroit-Warren-Dearborn, and Kalamazoo-Portage MSAs displayed the leading percentage gains over this period. Total employment declined over the year in the Bay City (-0.8%) MSA, the Upper Peninsula (-0.7%), and the Midland (-0.2%) and Saginaw (-0.1%) MSAs. Employment was essentially unchanged since November 2015 in both the Jackson and Niles-Benton Harbor MSAs.

Labor Force Levels Up Over Month, Year

During November, workforce levels increased in 11 regions and declined in five. The labor force in the Niles-Benton Harbor MSA was essentially unchanged over the month. Workforce advances ranged from 0.4 to 1.0 percent with a median increase of 0.8 percent. Reductions were limited to - 0.8 percent or less, with the largest declines recorded in the state's three northernmost labor market areas.

Between November 2015 and November 2016, labor force levels rose in 15 regions with a median gain of 1.0 percent. Since November 2015, the Bay City MSA and the Upper Peninsula showed minor workforce reductions.

Seasonal Reduction in Leisure and Hospitality Services Lowers November Jobs

The monthly survey of employers indicated that seasonally unadjusted payroll jobs in Michigan declined by 7,000 in November to 4,400,000. Seasonal job cuts were recorded in leisure and hospitality services (-15,000) and construction (-5,000). Somewhat offsetting these reductions was a seasonal job gain in trade, transportation and utilities (+9,000). The state's remaining industry sectors were little changed over the month.

Within trade, transportation and utilities, retail trade jobs rose by 6,000 over the month as merchants continued hiring for the holiday shopping season.

From October to November, metro area payroll jobs were mixed and little changed. Seven of the 14 major metro regions in the state recorded mostly minor job reductions with a median decline of -0.5 percent. Six metropolitan areas posted minor job additions of 0.6 percent or less, and payroll jobs were essentially unchanged over the month in the Saginaw MSA.

From November 2015 to November 2016, seasonally unadjusted payroll jobs rose statewide by 83,000 or 1.9 percent. Nearly all major industry sectors in the state recorded job gains since November 2015 with the exception of a minor job cut in trade, transportation and utilities.

Since November 2015, payroll jobs increased in 11 of the 14 metro areas, with a 1.8 percent median advance. The largest over-the-year job gains on a percentage basis were displayed in the Ann Arbor, Kalamazoo-Portage, and Grand Rapids-Wyoming MSAs. Payroll jobs fell slightly over the year in the Bay City and Jackson MSAs, while jobs were essentially unchanged over this period in the Midland metro area.

County Jobless Rates Up Over Month, Year

Forty-six of Michigan's 83 counties reported mostly minor jobless rate hikes in November, with the most pronounced rate increases shown in the state's northern areas. Unemployment rates declined over the month in 29 counties, while the rates in eight counties were unchanged.

Since November 2015, jobless rates rose slightly in 73 counties, with a minor median hike of 0.4 of a percentage point. Unemployment rates declined in six counties over the year, and the rates were unchanged in four.

Note: Data in this release is **not seasonally adjusted**. As a result, employment and unemployment trends may differ from previously released Michigan seasonally adjusted data. A breakdown of seasonally unadjusted November workforce estimates for Michigan and its 17 major labor market areas follows, along with a listing of county jobless rates for November.
